The Liturgy of Tenebrae Tenebrae (meaning "darkness" or "shadows") is the morning prayer of the church on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It involves extinguishing candles one by one as Christ goes through his passion. This adaptation of the Liturgy of Tenebrae works well in schools and has an impact on pupils.

Tenebrae consisted of two components of the Divine Office, Matins and Lauds, which originated from the monastic liturgy and were chanted by the monks after midnight and before dawn respectively. But from the early Middle Ages, the Church, wishing to make these "hours" available during Holy Week at a more convenient time for the faithful, joined them into one single service to be performed on the Wednesday, Thursday and Friday evenings, thus anticipating Matins and Lauds of Holy Thursday ...

Tenebrae services generally occur between Wednesday and Friday of Holy Week. The service marks Jesus' journey to Golgotha and allows for extended meditation through proclamation of the Word in scripture and sermon, as well as through music, increasing darkness, and silent reflection.

Service of Tenebrae

The Tenebrae service is usually done in Early morning, formerly also at night or Midnight. It consists of Readings from Scriptures (usually 7, 8, or 15, and even in some churches in ancient times, as many as 12, 24 or 72!). Especially included in the Readings is the Book of Lamentations.

The service of Tenebrae, meaning "darkness" or "shadows," has been practiced by the church since medieval times. Once a service for the monastic community, Tenebrae later became an important part of the worship of the common folk during Holy Week. We join Christians of many generations throughout the world in using the liturgy of Tenebrae.

Tenebrae: A Service of Shadows—Calvin University

A Tenebrae service presents 14 psalms, extinguishing one candle on a triangular stand after each of the psalms. The final candle, representing Christ, is then hidden from view, leaving the church in darkness. The bang of a book closing or feet stamping was in medieval times a signal to the congregation that they could leave.
